## Where Do I Begin?

Begin each day with the Prayer of Illumination to help, prepare your heart to hear God's word for you. Read "to be formed and transformed rather than to gather information...Read with a vulnerable heart. Expect to be blessed...Read as one awake, one waiting for the beloved. Read with reverence."

Let us Pray a *Prayer of Illumination*:

All-Seeing One, above me, around me, within me guide my vision as I engage with your sacred words. Look down upon me, look out from within me, look all around me. See through my eyes, hear through my ears, feel through my heart. God of Wisdom, touch me where I need to be touched; and when my heart is touched, give me the grace to lay down this Holy Book and ask significant questions: Why has my heart been touched by you? How am I to be changed through your touch? All-Seeing One, I need to change, I need to look a little more like You. May these sacred words change and transform me. Then I can meet You face to face...when I shall be healed forever. Your Word and the touch of your Spirit bring healing... a healing that will last. O Eye of God, look not away. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Amen.

## FRIDAY OF EASTER WEEK - Day 52

OUTWARD APPEARANCES Colossians 2:16-23

Therefore do not let anyone condemn you in matters of food and drink or of observing festivals, new moons, or sabbaths. These are only a shadow of what is to come, but the substance belongs to Christ. Do not let anyone disqualify you, insisting on self-abasement and worship of angels, dwelling on visions, puffed up without cause by a human way of thinking, and not holding fast to the head, from whom the whole body, nourished and held together by its ligaments and sinews, grows with a growth that is from God.

If with Christ you died to the elemental spirits of the universe, why do you live as if you still belonged to the world? Why do you submit to regulations, "Do not handle, Do not taste, Do not touch"? All these regulations refer to things that perish with use; they are simply human commands and teachings. These have indeed an appearance of wisdom in promoting self-imposed piety, humility, and severe treatment of the body, but they are of no value in checking selfindulgence.

#### WHAT DID YOU "GIVE UP"

When I was a young girl I did not go to church. All I knew about "Lent" was that you gave something up. I would be asked, "What are you giving up for Lent?" Then they would share with me that they were giving up chocolate, or sweets or some other food item that they liked a lot. I did not equate it with a religious ritual, I probably thought of it as a *restart* for a New Year's resolution. It was years and years before I understood it as a religious ritual and it probably took even more years to understand why people *gave something up* for the season of Lent. Even today when I think of Lent I do not think so much of giving something up - like chocolate or ice cream (let it not be so :-)) - as adding something to - like giving to a special charity or adding an additional prayer time.

But here the author of Colossians devotes quite a bit of space criticizing an outward show of piety that does not reflect an inward commitment to God through Christ Jesus. In the last sentence we get to the crux of it: *These have indeed an appearance of wisdom in promoting*  *self-imposed piety, humility, and severe treatment of the body, but they are of no value in checking self-indulgence.* And so the lesson is this: By making a show of your piety by these *human ways of thinking*, then you are not growing in your faith in a way *that is from God.* In other words, do what you do for the glory of God, and God alone. Jesus says it like this: "Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven." (Matthew 6:1)

#### PRAYER

Free me from self-indulging behaviors, let me not deny myself only to be seen by others, but free me in service only for your glory, dear Lord. Amen
